5. SAFETY SATURDAY

A. Discussion pertaining to the 2023 Event Planning

i. Discussion pertaining to event vendors

The Safety Saturday Committee assists in the planning and organization of Safety Saturday. The mission of Safety Saturday is to provide a free and safe event for the community. Safety Saturday is scheduled for May 20, 2023 from 9 AM to 1 PM at the Children's Hospital site.

The Commission discussed any issues from the 2022 Safety Saturday Event. Commissioner Warczak reported the Wheel of Fortune game was too close to the DJ. Participants and Volunteers could not communicate with each other since it was so loud. It was suggested to move the game further away.

ii. Discussion pertaining to date of the event

Officer Hippler reported that Officer Fus is working with Children's Hospital to confirm the date. Commissioners were asked to invite safety-type businesses that may be interested in participating. For more information, please contact Officer Tony Fus at fus@nbpolice.org.

The Commission discussed activities and vendors that are being contacted for 2023 such as; the bouncy houses, rock climbing wall, DJ, Cleveland Pub Food, Flight for Life, Sprecher booth, chairs, generators, bike helmet handouts, and demonstrations. Alderman Hopkins will work throughout the community to obtain the In-Kind donations.

Volunteers will be needed to; chaperone the bouncy houses, set-up, take-down, traffic control, collect garbage, and assist with *hand-out and fit the bike helmets*.

Officer Hippler reported the balance of Safety Saturday account is at \$7,000. There were no expenses paid to date.

A. Status of Police Department Community Programs

The Midnight Basketball for teens has been well attended and wraps up in March.

The End of Year Crime Summary Report has been released. The majority of calls continue to be for wellness checks, scams & fraud. Officer Hippler encouraged "If you see something, say something". Citizens continue to help police apprehend suspects by calling in suspicious behavior.

There has been an increase in thefts of catalytic convertors from vehicles parked outside homes and businesses throughout southeastern Wisconsin.

8. NEW BUSINESS

A. Monthly PD Update

Officer Hippler has reported that the department is now fully staffed with the hiring of five (5) new officers. Three (3) Officers were lateral moves from other departments and two (2) are now training at WCTC.

Effective immediately, the lobby hours have changed to Monday through Friday, 7:00 AM – 11:00 PM, there will no longer be any weekend hours.

Dash cameras for the squads will be installed in the next month and training will begin soon. Body cameras have been distributed to the NBPD and training is complete. Information from the cameras will be able to be transferred to the District Attorney and the public.

The NBPD was awarded a three (3) year accreditation by the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Accreditation Group (WILEAG). The accreditation program requires law enforcement agencies to comply with state-of-the-art standards in four basic areas: policy and procedures, administration, operations, and support services.
