The meeting was called to order via Zoom format at 6:30 P.M. by Chair Laurie DeMoss.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Commissioner/Treasurer Warczak reported that budget expenditures for 2021 totaled \$1012.00, and that \$988.00 would be turned over to the City.

\$2000.00 was approved for the 2022 budget. Expenditures will include the cemetery benches, signs for the Arcadian Hills Residential Historic District, and sign replacement for the New Berlin Historical Park.

Commissioner/Treasurer Warczak will check to see if the \$40.00 WAHPC dues will be charged this year, as last year, an exemption was made due to the pandemic.

Discussion: Chair DeMoss asked for discussion on ranking the 3 properties listed as to their importance in focusing our work this year. It was felt that Cornfalfa Farms should be made a priority for National Historic Landscape or local Landmark status.

Commissioner Marquardt, who had been in contact with personnel from the Milwaukee Astronomical Society Observatory, felt that they might be more comfortable with an Informational Marker rather than Landmark status. Thus, this item was moved to the second bullet point, Informational Marker consideration.

Commissioner Ament had been researching the Jaske Property on S. Johnson Road, but in her absence, it was decided to keep this on the Landmark consideration list until she is able to provide an update.
