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PUBLIC HEARING – 6:30 PM – 6:45 PM.

Property for Landmark Consideration Located at 3820 S. Woelfel Road, New Berlin, WI 53146, Known as the **Imig-Woelfel Farmstead, to Include Farmhouse, Barn and Outbuildings.**

Liaison: Commissioner Hemmen.

Guests: Karen Woelfel Cooper (Great-great-granddaughter of George Woelfel, Jr. who purchased the property and farmstead in 1887), and Randy Cooper.

Chair DeMoss read a description of the **Property**, written by Dianne Keller, daughter of Roger Woelfel, who currently owns the farmstead.

MOTION TO APPROVE THE DESCRIBED PROPERTY AS AN OFFICIAL NEW BERLIN LANDMARK.

Motion passed unanimously.

Our Landmarks Commission meeting to be held October 20, 2022 will start at 6:30 PM with a short reception to officially acknowledge the new Landmark. The owners and family members will be invited and cake will be served. (At the Landmarks meeting, the time of the reception was set at 6:00 PM, but before the minutes were submitted to the City for distribution, the homeowner's representative requested that 6:30 PM would be more convenient for the family).

The Landmarks Commission Meeting was called to order by Chair DeMoss at 6:45 PM.

Present: Chair DeMoss, Alderwoman Kroupa, Commissioners Ament, Hemmen, Hermann, Tyskiewicz and Warczak.

Excused: Commissioners Marquardt and Orzel.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES.

MOTION TO Approve July 21, 2022 Landmarks Commission Meeting Minutes.

Motion by: Commissioner Warczak.

Second by: Commissioner Hemmen.

Motion passed unanimously. Alderwoman Kroupa, and Commissioners Hemmen and Hermann were excused from the July 21, 2022 Landmarks Commission Meeting, and voted "Present" on this Motion.

TREASURER'S REPORT – COMMISSIONER/TREASURER WARCZAK.

1. Commissioner/Treasurer Warczak distributed a budget ledger showing our expenses from 2020 – Present.
2. Thus far in 2022, we have expenses of \$1036.00 and a balance of \$964.00.

COMMUNICATIONS – CHAIR DeMOSS.

Any Commissioner interested in attending the October WAHPC Conference either in-person (Rothschild, WI) or virtually, should let her know, as the Commission Budget can contribute to the registration fee, with the Commissioner(s) reporting their experiences to the Commission.

OLD BUSINESS.

1. **Update from Eagle Scout Prospect Kayden Wilson** on proposed project at New Berlin Center Cemetery.
 - a. Biological Solution for cleaning the gravestones has been purchased and obtained. Kayden is scheduled to pick this up from Chair DeMoss.
 - b. A date for work to begin is needed from Kayden so that Commissioner Ament can order the necessary supplies to be delivered to the cemetery: Porta-Potties, water tank, picnic tables, and safety equipment.
