1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm.

Joe Rieder welcomed Mary English and Anne-Marie St John, two new citizen members to the Safety Commission, Steve Kon welcomed Lieutenant Mark O'Conner (NBFD), as it was anticipated he would eventually be taking over Kon's role on the Safety Commission.

4. NEW BUSINESS

- A. **23-5:** Alderman Harenda (via a resident) has requested looking into engineering controls and/or police enforcement to address speeding vehicles on Sunny Slope Road, between Grange Avenue and College Avenue.

Lucas Pichler provided a synopsis of the complaint, as well as traffic study data for Sunny Slope Road, which was collected between 04/24/23 – 04/27/23. The average speed was 40 mph, the 85th percentile speed was 43 mph, and the percentage of enforceable violations (45 mph or greater) was nine percent. Pichler further provided a graph, which showed the most problematic times of the day for speeding were around 8:00 AM, and 4:30 PM.

Pichler advised there had been past requests for a pedestrian crosswalk near Elmwood Elementary School, which included a request for a pedestrian refuge. Pichler advised Sunny Slope Road was scheduled to undergo possible reconstruction in 2026 or 2027, at which time the pedestrian refuge could be considered. Pichler advised Sunny Slope Road was an arterial roadway, which generally made it an inappropriate roadway for speed humps. Pichler advised there were not very many options for engineering controls, but suggested speed enforcement as an option. Steve Brooks also volunteered the streets department to look at the signage in the area to ensure it was clear and in good condition.
